

Battlemap : Standing Stones

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MAP DESCRIPTION

The ring of standing stones is a well known landmark in the north. It actually consists of two rings of monolithic stones surrounding an even taller menhir atop a grassy hill. The outer ring consists of twenty four smaller stones on which an equal number of slightly smaller stones rest forming an unbroken circle. The inner circle consists only of ten stones although those stand slightly taller they are still dwarfed by the central menhir. All these standing stones with the exception of the central menhir are inscribed with countless lines of some runic script.

Rumors say that this circle was erected by the warlord Vaelar in the distant past before he led his army to an unknown doom in the icy wastes of the north and that the scriptures are actually the names of the fallen. Other rumors speculate that the warlord himself might actually be buried under this hill, but no one ever dared to try and dig him up.




The hill of standing stones

ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTION

This battle map is divided into twelve segments to fit the letter format of the document and allow for easy printing. You can find all the individual sections of the map on the following pages. They are ordered from A to L. Print those pages, cut out the individual map segments and assemble them as shown in the following illustration and connect them using either glue or tape.

When cutting remember: The individual segments on the following pages do not overlap! You will have to allow for some overlap yourself. E.g.: leave some white space on one or two sides of most map segments.
